Introduction

Looking for accommodation can sometimes be a tiring and demanding process, but be patient and allow at least 2 weeks finding the accommodation that is right for you. It is better for you to take your time now and settle in a comfortable place rather than rush to move to a place where you won't enjoy staying.

Here are some tips to consider before you start your search.

- **It is better to live close to campus.**

Although accommodation around campus may not be the cheapest in Melbourne, there are many advantages to living close to campus: Access to the library, computer labs and other support facilities. You will be living close to your classmates so it is easy to meet to work on group projects. You will save money and time on travel.

- **Be clear about what you are getting yourself into**

Students often rush to find accommodation when they first arrive. Sometimes they commit themselves to contracts that they regret. Think carefully before you chose your accommodation. Find out as much as possible about the costs, facilities and the people you will be living with.

Share Accommodation

What is it?

Share accommodation means moving into shared house or apartment with other people. They may be other Swinburne students or just local residents. The room may or may not be furnished and the room rate may or may not include utilities (gas, water, electricity).

How do I find arrange share accommodation?

1. Search for share accommodation

- **Swinburne Student Housing Database located at www.swin.edu.au/housing.**

You will need a student number to access this database.

2. Call the contact person and arrange a time to meet and inspect the property

Things to think about when choosing a share house.

- Do you want to live with male/female/both.
- Do you want to live with international students /Australian residents.
- Consider religious/cultural differences
- Consider smoking/alcohol
- How are the bills shared
- Cook arrangements shared/separate
- Other house duties (cleaning, shopping etc)
- Having friends visit/stay over.
- Sharing bathrooms
- Use of other's furniture and belongings
- Use of music or television
- Study or quiet time

IMPORTANT

- Do they have the same likes and dislikes (e.g. food, hobbies)?
- Do you think you would be comfortable living with these people?
- Will the accommodation be a good environment for you to study?

3. Sign the lease, pay bond and rent

- Go to the agent with the other tenants and make sure all of your names are on the lease
- Keep a copy of the lease for yourself
- Make sure your bond is paid to the RTBA (Residential Tenancy Bond Authority), check with your agent. (see RTBA website www.rtba.vic.gov.au)
- If you pay bond to the previous tenant, make sure the bond is transferred into your name so that you can get your money back when you leave.
- Make sure you get a receipt for all monies you pay for bond and rent.

4. Move in

• Condition Report

Before you move in, it is very important that **you complete a condition report**; this is a report that lists all defects in your new room. Eg cracked windows, stained carpet etc. This will protect you from being charged for property damage that was not your fault.

• Buy Furniture

Rental Accommodation

What is it?

Renting a vacant house or apartment through a real estate agent.
Rental properties are usually unfurnished and require a 12 month lease contract
You may have to find a flatmate to share the property with you

How do I arrange rental accommodation?

1. Where to look

- Check newspapers: particularly 'The Age' and 'Herald Sun' on Wednesdays and Saturdays

2. Make an appointment with the Real Estate Agent to inspect the properties that you like or collect the key from their office.

- To borrow the key from the agent you must show some photo ID and leave a key **deposit** (\$50 - \$70 refundable on return)
- If inspection is only available "BY APPOINTMENT", you must give your contact details to the agent and they will advise you of the next inspection time.

Tip: A mobile phone, it is very useful for house-hunting. So that agents can easily contact you.

Tip: If you don't know where the properties are www.whereis.com.au a useful website that will show you the property locations

3. Inspect the Property

- Check the property thoroughly

CHECKLIST

- Does the property have heating?
- Is the carpet and paint in good condition?
- Does the property have a communal laundry?
- Are the appliances gas or electric? Gas is cheaper.
- Are there signs of water leakage? Does it smell OK?
- Is it close to campus/ close to transport?
- Do the door/window locks work?

4. Lodge an Application form.

- Get an application form from the agent
- Fill out the form carefully and neatly
- Attach as many supporting documents as possible:
 - copy of passport
 - bank statements
 - evidence of financial support
 - Swinburne offer letter
 - reference letter from Swinburne International (see Accommodation Officer)
 - references from previous landlords and employers.
 - Any other documents that support your application
- Follow up your application with a phone call to enquire on its progress

5. Application Accepted

You will receive a phone call from the Real Estate Agent – make sure you give your phone number so they can contact you. If you don't receive a call within 2 days of submitting your application, you should call and enquire about your application.

6. Sign the Lease and receive the key

• The Lease

At this time, **the lease** will also need to be signed; however, before you do this, read it very carefully to make sure you agree with all the details. The lease contains all details regarding your rent and occupying the flat. (Note: all the people who will be occupying the flat should be mentioned in the lease. This means that everyone will be responsible for the rent).

• The Bond

When you sign the lease, you must pay your first month's rent plus a **bond** (equivalent to one month's rent). **You must fill in the Bond Lodgement Form** when you pay your bond. Bond is normally paid directly to the RTBA (Residential Tenancy Bond Authority)

Once you have paid the bond and 1 month rent, and signed the lease, you should receive the following documents from the agent:

- An information booklet called ***Renting a Home – A Guide for Tenants and Landlord*** you should read this thoroughly because it tells you all about your rights as a tenant and also the rights of the landlord. This is available in various languages from the Department of Consumer Affairs - www.consumer.vic.gov.au/
- A copy of the agreement or lease and a copy of the bond lodgement form
- A condition report (a list stating the condition of all rooms and their contents)
- A receipt for the bond and a receipt for the rent you have paid.
- A set of keys to the property
- The landlord or agent's full name, address, phone & fax number
- A statement setting out the agents power to authorise urgent repairs and the agent's phone and fax numbers for urgent repairs

7. Connecting Gas, Electricity and Telephone

- Most agents offer a free connection services, this is an easy way to have all your utilities connected for you.
- Most phone companies have a connection fee, phone rental fee and service fee, which are charged monthly on the account. The account set up fee will come on the first bill.

8. Moving in

• Condition Report

When you move in, **you must complete a condition report**. This report documents the condition of the flat prior to your moving in. This report protects you from being blamed for damages to the flat before you moved in. So, be very careful to record any marks or damage eg: stains on the carpet, holes in plaster, cracked windows, broken lights or door handles.

Send the condition report to your agent within 3 days. Once you return it, they will send one copy back to you, signed by the landlord.

• Furniture

You can buy furniture from shops or other students. Check the notice boards on campus as to what students are selling. Markets and *The Trading Post* is another good place to buy second-hand household goods. If you need to move furniture from another house there are furniture movers who specialise in student removals.

9. Moving Out

Before you leave the apartment make sure you have

- Given adequate written notice to the Agent of your intention to leave (usually 28 days). This condition applies even if your lease is expiring.
- Advise the electricity, Telephone and gas authorities that you are leaving.
- Clean the flat, most agents require you to have the carpet steam cleaned.
- Advise the University of your new address.

Once the flat has been inspected by the Real Estate Agent and found in good order, your bond will be refunded to you.

Homestay Conditions

- Homestay bookings should be made at least ten days prior to arrival
- Placement fee - \$200 paid at the time of lodging an application
- Minimum 4 week Homestay – Paid in Advance upon the acceptance of the homestay offer.
- Homestay Fee per week is AUD (over18 - \$265) & (17 years of age - \$285)
- Internet Access \$10 per Week – Paid directly to Host
- Homestay includes 3 meals per day, a furnished bedroom, electricity, gas and water, but not telephone calls.
- The student will need to give both Host and AHN Homestay two weeks' notice when vacating
