Bachelor of Engineering (Product Design Engineering)

The [Bachelor of Engineering \(Product Design Engineering\)](#) aims to educate a new generation of creative product design engineers.

The course is run jointly by the Faculty of Design and the Faculty of Engineering and Industrial Sciences and aims to equip graduates with:

- A sound knowledge of the principles and processes of product design
- The ability to design products with a sound engineering base
- An understanding of traditional and innovative processes in developing successful products for competitive markets
- Skills to incorporate legal, social, ethical and environmental issues in product design.

Graduates will be able to seek employment in design, development and manufacture of domestic products or the automobile industry. Students are required to study at the Hawthorn and Prahran campuses.

Bachelor of Aviation (Management)

The [Bachelor of Aviation \(Management\)](#), formerly Bachelor of Technology (Air Transportation Management), provides the necessary preparation for non-flying careers in the aviation industry. It covers the operational aspects airline and airport operation which, in Australia and abroad, operate in a highly complex environment of deregulation, governmental agreements and commercial pressures.
